Level III	MFB	Impermissible Recruiting Contact (NCAA Bylaw 13.1.1.1)	A coach made brief but impermissible contact (in excess of a greeting) with a prospective student-athlete at his educational institution.	The involved coaching staff member was prohibited from participating in off-campus recruiting activity for 30 days. In-person on or off-campus contact with the prospective student-athlete was prohibited for 30 days. The total number of permissible contacts with the prospective student-athlete was reduced by two (2). The total number of permissible spring evaluation days was reduced by two (2).	1/30/2020
Level III	WBB	Impermissible Recruiting Publicity (NCAA Bylaw 13.10.2.1)	An assistant coach inadvertently (but impermissibly) posted an emoji on a Twitter thread where two unsigned prospective student athletes were discussing their game performances.	The institution provided rules education to the sport staff. The coaching staff was prohibited from sending recruiting correspondence (written or electronic) to the involved prospective student-athletes for two weeks.	11/14/2020
SEC	***	Impermissible Competition (SEC Policy)	Two student-athletes impermissibly competed unattached in a competition where student-athletes representing UGA also competed.	The responsible staff member received a letter of reprimand and was prohibited from attending all countable and required athletically-related activities for one day during the sport's season. Level III	SWM	Exceeding Countable Coach Limits (NCAA Bylaw 11.7.1.1)	A non-institutional staff member provided impermissible instruction to two student-athletes during practice.	The responsible coach was prohibited from attending all countable and required athletically-related activities involving student-athletes for two weeks. The responsible coach will be prohibited from attending one competition during the 2021-2022 academic year.	2/15/2021
Level III	MTE	Exceeding Student-Athlete Time Limits (NCAA Bylaw 17.1.7.4)	Student-athletes did not receive a required day off during one week of the Spring term.	The team was required to take two days off during another Spring term week. The institution provided rules education to the coaching staff.	2/27/2021
