| Level III | MFB   | Impermissible Telephone Communication<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.1.3.1)    | Coach returned a phone call from prospect prior to the permissible date for outgoing telephone communication.   | The involved coach was prohibited from engaging in telephone calls with any prospect for seven days. The sport staff was prohibited from calling the involved prospect for two weeks once permissible to do so. The sport staff was prohibited from engaging in electronic correspondence with the involved prospect for 14 days. The sport staff received rules education regarding telephone calls. | 11/28/2020 |
| Level III | WBB   | Impermissible Recruiting Correspondence<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.02.5.6) | A non-coaching staff member mistakenly sent electronic correspondence to a high school coach during the recruiting shutdown period.   | The sport staff was prohibited from sending recruiting correspondence (written or electronic) to any prospective student-athletes at the involved high school for two weeks.  | 8/18/2021  |
| Level III | WEQ   | Impermissible Recruiting Inducement<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.2.1.1)      | A staff member inadvertently paid for a prospective student-athlete's appetizer, valued at \$11, when they ate together at a restaurant during an unofficial visit. The restaurant mistakenly placed the prospect's appetizer on the staff member's bill, and the staff member did not discover the addition until she submitted the receipt for reimbursement. | The institution provided additional rules education to the sport staff related to unofficial visits and meals. The prospective student-athlete is required to repay the value of the benefit (\$11) to a charity of her choice.   | 9/15/2021  |
| Level III | MFB   | Impermissible Recruiting Inducement<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.2.1.1)      | A prospective student-athlete impermissibly stayed two nights in the off-campus apartment of a current student-athlete. The sport staff did not arrange the lodging and was not aware.  | The prospective student-athlete is required to repay the value of the lodging to a charity of his choice. The institution provided rules education to the involved student-athlete.   | 9/17/2021  |
| Level III | TRK   | Exceeding Student-Athlete Time Limits<br>(NCAA Bylaw 17.1.7.2)    | Student-athletes exceeded their weekly practice time limits by 1 hour on two consecutive weeks.   | The involved student-athletes' practice time limits were reduced by two hours for two consecutive weeks. The institution provided rules education to the sport staff.   | 9/18/2021  |

| Level III | TRK | Impermissible Recruiting Contact<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.1.1.3)    | A non-coaching staff member made a phone call to and exchanged text messages with a student-athlete at another institution prior to the student-athlete entering the transfer portal. The non-coaching staff member previously worked at the other institution and had a longstanding relationship with the student-athlete. The phone call and text messages were not recruiting or athletically related.                             | The institution ceased recruitment of the involved student-athlete. The institution provided rules education to the sport staff.   | 9/23/2021  |
| Level III | MFB | Impermissible Recruiting Inducement<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.2.1.1) | A prospective student-athlete and his mother stayed overnight at the house of a non-coaching athletics staff member, who is a close and long-time friend of the prospect's mother. The sport staff did not arrange the lodging and was not aware.  | The sport staff may not have on-campus contact with the recruit for 90 days. The sport staff may only have one off-campus contact with the prospect during his senior year. The recruit is required to pay the value of the lodging to a charity of his choice. The institution provided rules education to the involved staff member.   | 10/2/2021  |
| Level III | MFB | Impermissible Recruiting Inducement<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.2.1.1) | A non-coaching staff member provided a \$50 loan to a prospective student-athlete's parent to complete a larger purchase at the bookstore. The parent was not able to pay the full purchase price and indicated that he would repay the amount once they returned to their car or reached an ATM. The non-coaching staff member failed to collect the repayment due to the family's hurry to depart campus and make their flight home. | The institution ceased recruitment of the involved prospective student-athlete. The involved noncoaching staff member was prohibited from engaging in any recruiting activities (on or off-campus) or communications for 90 days. The additional staff member present was prohibited from recruiting off-campus for 30 days. The sport staff is prohibited from accompanying a prospective student-athlete or their guests into the bookstore. The institution provided rules education. | 10/17/2021 |
| Level III | TRK | Comments Before Commitment<br>(NCAA Bylaw 13.10.1.1)         | A non-coaching staff member impermissibly posted a graphic stating a prospective student-athlete signed with UGA one day prior to the prospective student-athlete signing a National Letter of Intent.   | The sport staff was prohibited from sending electronic communication to any prospective student-athletes for one week.   | 3/22/2022  |
